Lindsey Nelson

The late broadcasting legend Lindsey Nelson, a native of Columbia, Tenn., began his storied association with his alma mater in the late 1930's. He served as a student assistant to legendary Tennessee football coach Gen. Robert R. Neyland, started the Vol Radio Network in 1949 and became sports information director in 1951. The University of Tennessee's baseball facility is named in honor of one of the school's most distinguished alums.

In the 1950's, Nelson began announcing college football and professional baseball for Liberty Broadcasting Network. The staggering list of sporting events broadcast by Nelson includes the World Series, the Davis Cup, the Masters, the National Open, the Rose, Cotton and Sugar Bowls, the NFL Championship Game, the NBA Championships and the NIT Tournament.

His ties to baseball are legendary as he served as the New York Mets' lead broadcaster for 17 seasons and as the voice of the San Francisco Giants for 3 seasons.

He was named National Sportscaster of the Year on five occasions, and has been inducted into no less than 12 halls of fame throughout the nation including, the Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum at Cooperstown, N.Y., in 1988, New York Mets' Hall of Fame at Shea Stadium, State of New York Sports Hall of Fame, National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Hall of Fame in Salisbury, N.C., American Sportscasters Hall of Fame in New York City, Mutual Broadcasting Hall of Fame in Nashville, East Tennessee Hall of Fame for the Performing Arts in Knoxville, College Football Hall of Fame, Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, and the LSU Athletic Hall of Fame in Baton Rouge, La.
